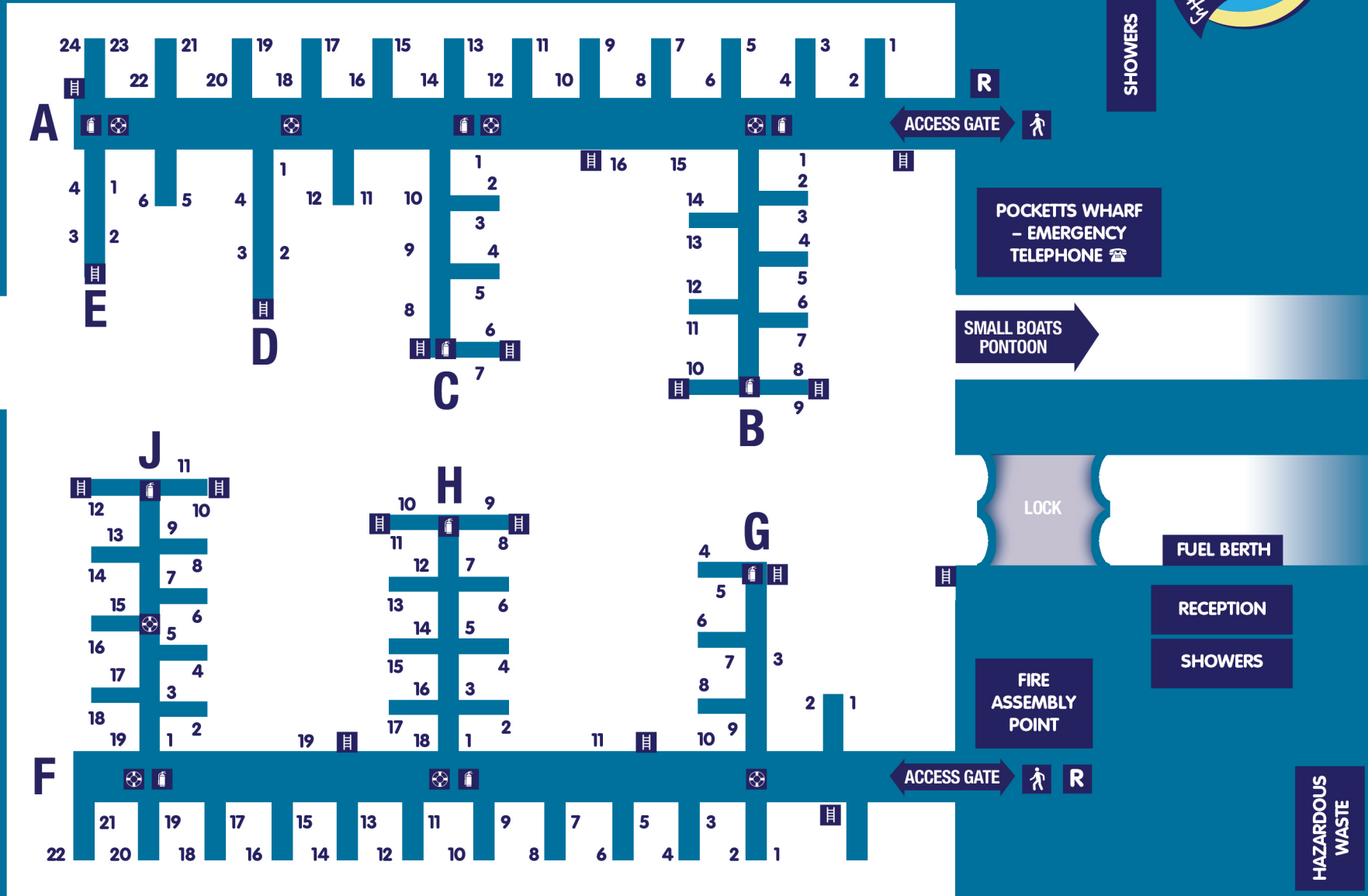
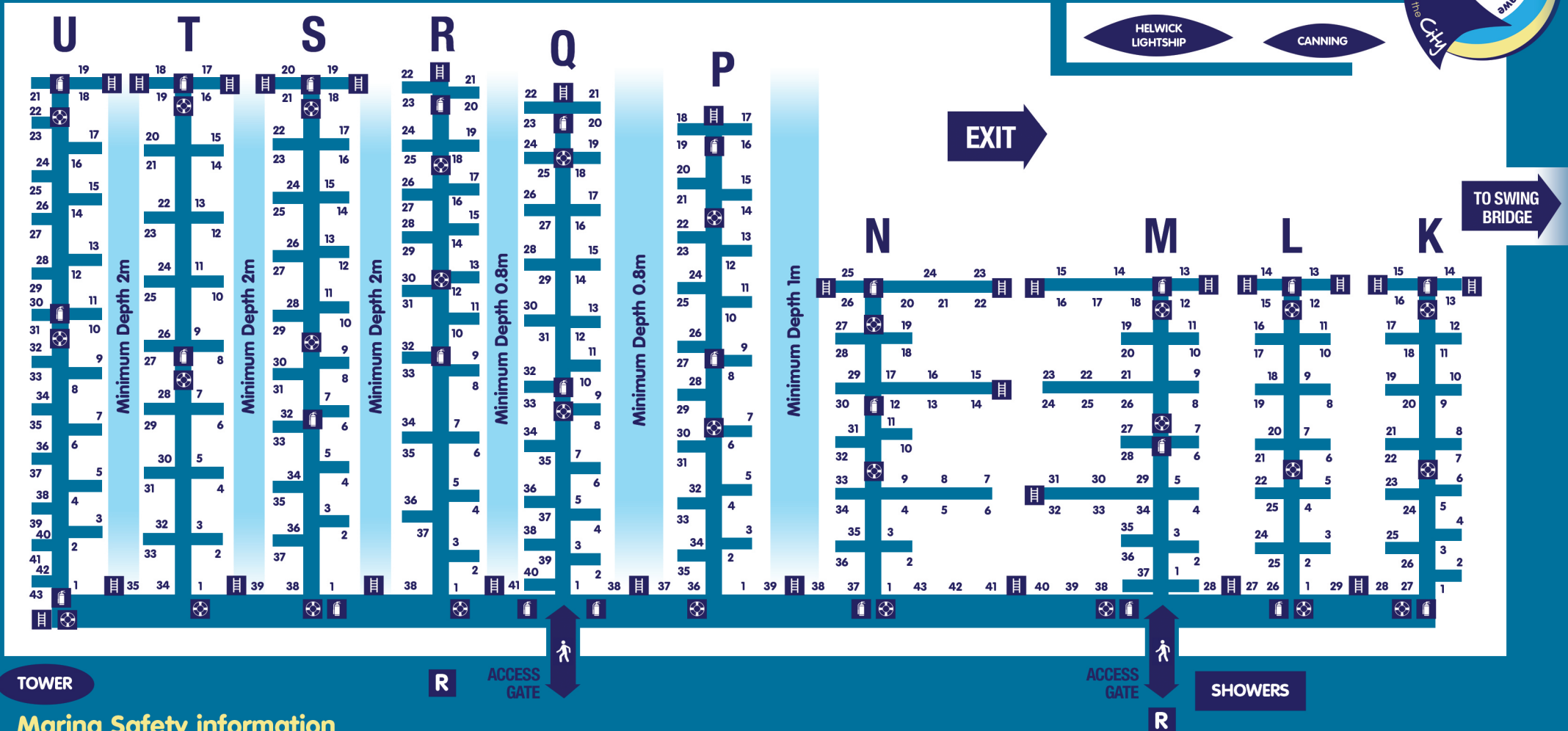

## Marina Safety information

- Please ensure that the security gate closes behind you. Do not allow access to strangers. In the event of gate failure, contact the Marina Office during office hours. Out of hours, contact Security to arrange a call out. Tel: 01792 646440.
- Please do not store any items on the pontoons. Do not obstruct safety equipment and do not tie up to safety ladders.
- In the event of an emergency dial 999 Emergency Services or call the Coastguard on Ch.16. An emergency telephone is located at Pocket's Wharf.
- Please prevent dogs fouling the walkways. Dogs must be kept on leads whilst on the pontoons.
- Vessels must not discharge sewage or contaminated bilge water into the marina.
- Refuse/Recycling points are located near each bridgehead. A hazardous waste point is also located at the boatyard available for disposing oil, filters, antifoul tins, batteries and gas bottles
- Re-fuelling must not take place on the pontoons, only on the designated fuelling berths. Barbecues must not take place on the pontoons
- A sluice room for emptying chemical toilets is located at the Main Office.
- Oil spills should be reported to the Marina immediately. Oil absorbent equipment is available at the Marina Office.
- Heavy maintenance must not be carried out without prior approval from the Marina Office.
- Life Jackets should be worn on pontoons in adverse weather conditions. Children should wear lifejackets at all times.
- To use electricity for the first time, simply purchase a £5 electricity card from a card dispenser located at "M" & "Q" bridgeheads. Future top-ups can be made at reception using this card.
